Taking a stand for academic freedom

Some significant dates

1953: Dr D.F. Malan announces Government's plans for introducing academic apartheid at UCT and Wits.

1953: Holloway Commission of Inquiry investigates financial and practical aspects of separate university training for black students.

1957/8: Introduction of Seperate University Education Bill, followed by introduction of the Extension of University **Education Bill.**

1959: Extension of University Education Act passed

1959: First T.B. Davie Memorial Lecture on academic freedom at UCT, and ceremony of Dedication to academic freedom.

1968: The "Mafeje Affair" leads to academic freedom protest at UCT

1968: A second brass plaque unveiled at UCT recording the restriction on the right to appoint teachers; "Re-dedication" to academic freedom

2008: 40th anniversary of sit-in held; formal apology to Archie Mafeje's family, posthumous honorary doctorate

2018: 50th anniversary commemorated at UCT
